Thanks to override funding approved by voters through the end of the 2025-2026 school year, Dysart offers an expansive arts program that provides students with a well-rounded education. The past two years, Dysart students earned the most Arizona State Seals of Arts Proficiency in the entire state, at 261. GETTING READY FOR THE FIRST DAY



PRESCHOOL

Dysart offers three preschool programs for children ages 2-5.

1. Growing Minds Preschool is a tuition-based program operated by the Community Education program. Growing Minds has a main campus as well as satellite sites at Freedom Traditional Academy, Marley Park, and Mountain View. Visit [Dysart.org/GrowingMinds](https://dysart.org/GrowingMinds) for details.
2. Developmental Preschool provides special education services to students with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) in an inclusive setting.
3. Peer Role Model Preschool is a program for typically developing children (who are 3 or 4 years old by December 31, 2025) to serve an important role in the classroom alongside students with developmental disabilities. A tuition rate of \$225/month is charged at non-Title I schools.

Is Your Preschooler's Development on Track?

If you are the parent of a preschool child or know of a preschool child with suspected developmental delays, residing within the boundaries of the Dysart Unified School District, you're eligible for a free Child Find screening. Suspected delays may be evidenced in the areas of communication, cognition, behavior, physical, auditory, visual and/or sensory development. Free screenings and/or diagnostic evaluations help determine those children eligible for special education services. KINDERGARTEN

Dysart's FREE, Full-Day Kindergarten Program is approved through May, 2026 thanks to voter-approved override funding. The Dysart kindergarten program follows Arizona state standards, and offers hands-on, real-life activities in the areas of cognitive, social, and physical development. Please note that current override funds for this program will expire for the 2026-2027 school year unless the Override continuation is approved in the November, 2025 election. SAFETY

Student safety and security is Dysart's top priority. We have numerous safety protocols in place, and strong partnerships with local law enforcement and first responders. Each campus has a Threat Assessment Team to investigate potential threats to individuals or the campus, and reports to law enforcement as needed. Schools schedule planned practice drills and staff training as well as conduct safety audits throughout the year, and specific safety protocols are in place for each type of emergency response such as evacuation, lockdown, modified lockdown, and shelter in place. School Safety Committees on each campus discuss and plan facility safety, bullying, discipline, and emergency response procedures regularly, and schools have a single point of entry for visitors and require sign-ins through the front office. Is My Child Eligible for Busing?

- **K-8:** Kindergarten through eighth grade students who are residents within a school attendance area and who live more than one and one-half radial mile from school. Please note this is not applicable to Freedom Traditional School, since it is an open enrollment school.
- **High School:** Ninth through twelfth grade students who are residents within a school attendance area and who live more than two radial miles from school.
- **Special Education:** Students with disabilities who require transportation, as indicated in their respective individual education programs. ESS transportation boundaries can be viewed at [Dysart.org/Transportation](https://dysart.org/Transportation) under "Transportation Eligibility."

PARENT TOOLS

Dysart provides parents with several tools to help you stay informed about your student's academic progress and classroom assignments, communicate with us, and make purchases throughout the school year. Keep this quick reference of our systems handy so you'll know where to go when you need something!

THINGS EVERY PARENT SHOULD KNOW

PARENTSQUARE

- **How to Adjust Your Notification Preferences:** We don't want you to get inundated with too many messages, so if you're getting notifications where you don't want them, or in multiple places, take a few minutes to update your preferences. With ParentSquare it's easy to set your preferences for how frequently, and where (email, text, app push notification) you receive notifications. Please note that due to the urgent nature of emergency alerts and notices, those will always override your preferences.
 - **How to Change Notification Preferences In the App:** Click on the menu in the top left corner, select "Account" and then "Notifications". Use the arrow on the right side of the school name to open the options if it is collapsed. DO NOT turn off School Alerts, as this is how we will send some of our timely and critical alerts to you that you won't want to miss!
 - **How to Change Notification Preferences on ParentSquare.com:** Once logged in, click on your name in the top right corner, and select "My Account" in the dropdown. Then select "Notification Settings" in the list of links on the left side bar. DO NOT turn off School Alerts, as this is how we will send some of our timely and critical alerts to you that you won't want to miss!

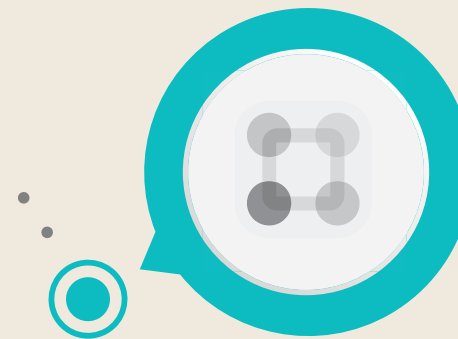
- **How to Update Your Contact Info and Language Preferences:** To make sure that we can keep you informed in emergency situations, please ensure that your contact information (email, phone number) is current in the Parent Portal at [Dysart.org/ParentPortal](https://dysart.org/ParentPortal). You are also able to adjust your language preferences here to ensure you are getting notifications in the language you prefer. There are over 130 language options to choose from.
- **How to View Student Grades and Attendance Records:** Student grade and attendance records are always found in the Parent Portal at [Dysart.org/ParentPortal](https://dysart.org/ParentPortal) or in the app.

HOW TO GET HELP

- **How to Contact a Teacher:** A Message through ParentSquare is typically the quickest way to contact a teacher, and you can easily do it through the ParentSquare app or website. 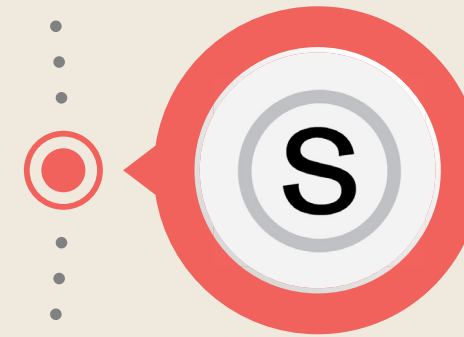

APPLY FOR FREE AND REDUCED MEALS / SUBMIT ALTERNATIVE INCOME FORM

All families at non-CEP schools should complete a Free and Reduced Lunch Application at SchoolCafe.com to help maintain school funding and make sure that qualified families receive this and other benefits. Only one application is required per family, and may be completed at [SchoolCafe.com](https://schoolcafe.com) starting in July.

Families with students at schools with free breakfast and lunch through the CEP program should complete an Alternative Income Form and submit it to Nutrition Services to help maintain school funding and make sure that qualified families receive this and other benefits.

DONATE THROUGH TAX CREDIT


Our community can support Dysart schools and receive a dollar-for-dollar state tax credit. Arizona Law (ARS 43-1089.01) allows married couples filing jointly a tax credit of up to \$400 and individual taxpayers a tax credit of up to \$200 when they contribute to extra-curricular activities in public schools. This tax credit is available to all who reside in Arizona and have a tax liability at least equal to that of their donation. You do not have to be a parent of a child in a Dysart school to benefit from this program. Donors may choose one of four categories and a school to support, and 100% of your donation goes directly where you designate it. Donations may be submitted through tax day each year. WHAT IT MEANS FOR YOU

Property owners in Dysart are currently paying annual property taxes to support school improvement bonds previously approved by the voters in 2006 and a maintenance and operations override previously approved by the voters in 2020. If the 2025 Override & Bond pass, homeowners would simply continue to support student needs.

Dysart Schools, its elected governing board, and a committee of community members all agreed to place an Override & Bond Election on the November 4, 2025 ballot. This mail-in only ballot provides our community an opportunity to share their voice for the children in our area. There are two initiatives on the ballot that focus on academic success, safety, and program offerings for students. Learn the facts and make sure you are registered and ready to vote!

KEY INFORMATION/DATES TO REMEMBER

The November 4, 2025 election is an all mail-in election. In an all-mail election, all voters will automatically be mailed a ballot. Registered voters have the option to return it by mail, drop it off at a secure ballot drop box, or vote on a replacement ballot in person. A CLOSER LOOK AT DYSART'S BUDGET

As a taxpayer-funded organization, the Dysart budget is an open book! We're transparent with how we receive and spend money, so we always have budget and financial report information posted on our website at [Dysart.org/Budget](https://dysart.org/Budget). UNDERSTANDING SCHOOL FUNDING

School funding can be very confusing, so we have a quick video to help explain it. We invite you to take a few minutes to watch it and learn more about the various places we receive funding from, and what restrictions we have on how we can spend it. Scan the QR code below to watch.

JUST THE FACTS

- 150 teacher positions are funded by the override to keep class sizes manageable, as well as a portion of all teacher salaries, which helps keep us competitive with surrounding districts.
- Overrides are approved for a period of seven years, but start phasing out in year five unless a continuation is approved by voters. The current override will begin phasing out in the 2026-2027 school year by one third of its value over the next three years (~\$8 million in reductions each year) if the continuation is not approved, and associated programs would be cut due to lack of funding.
- Charter schools receive more funding from the state than districts, even though they are both taxpayer funded. As a result, charter schools can spend extra tax dollars without voter approval and aren't allowed to request extra funding through elections.
- The last voter-approved bond that was passed in Dysart was in 2006. Voters rejected bonds for Dysart in 2013, 2019 and again in 2024, and the 2006 bond will be completely phased out of the current tax rate by 2028.
- Between 2014 and 2021, Dysart's capital funding was shorted over \$60 million dollars, a problem that was seen statewide. Several of those years Dysart received only \$1.4 - 1.5 million for the entire year, which has impacted our ability to maintain and replace aging facilities, buses and equipment, as those funds also have to cover educational and operational software costs.

Dysart is an "A" rated district with the top K-8 schools in Surprise. Five Dysart schools scored in the top 10% of the state, and Freedom Traditional Academy was ranked 7th out of 1,376 schools. An impressive 100% of Dysart schools have an "A" or "B" rating! Overall, Dysart has 18 "A" rated schools, 8 of which out-rank our local counterparts. All four high schools were named U.S. News & World Report "Best High Schools," and are in the Top 70 in Arizona, including #25 ranked Shadow Ridge High School.
