hope everyone is having a wonderful week! A couple of items have come to my attention in reference to campus safety I wanted to address.

If your student rides a bike to school, please ensure they are walking it across the crosswalks, this also applies to scooters. On several instances students have fallen into the roadway or run into other pedestrians/students walking during morning or afternoon traffic.

Additionally, if your student walks home west bound from the school and walks through the park, please ensure they are not staying at the park. Recently criminal damage has been found at the park and students are reporting other students causing the damage. The park west of the school is owned by the Ashton Ranch community HOA and not a public park. They have stated they will aid in prosecution for damage to the park if an offender is identified. Please help us keep the park clean, damage free, and safe for the residents who pay dues for access.

Finally, I wanted to send another courtesy reminder about drop-off. If you drop off your student in the morning, please ensure you are doing it in the drop off line at the south side of the school and not in the roadway. Although this issue has been better, we still have parents dropping students in the roadway near crosswalks obstructing bike lanes. When this happens, you become a traffic hazard. Please help us keep all students safe by using these designated areas for drop off.
