HANDBOOK FOCUS OF THE WEEK: DISRUPTION

Threatening an educational institution by interference with or disruption of the school per A.R.S. §13-2911 and §15-841.

Creating disturbances in class, on campus or at school-sponsored events.

Continual or repeated disruptions may warrant more severe consequences (Dialing 911)

Please review the handbook regarding student behavior expectations and their definitions. You can find the [Student and Parent Handbook](#) online. These topics are found on pages 52 & 60.

A. Disorderly conduct; classification A.R.S 13-1204. A person commits disorderly conduct if, with intent to disturb the peace or quiet of a Neighborhood, family or person, or with knowledge of doing so such person:

1. Engages in fighting, violent or seriously disruptive behavior; or
2. Makes unreasonable noise; or
3. Uses abusive or offensive language or gestures to any person present in a manner likely to provoke immediate physical retaliation by such person.

B. Interference with or disruption of an educational institution; violation; classification; definitions. A.R.S. 13-2911

1. person commits interference with or disruption of an educational institution by doing any of the following:

- a) Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly interfering with or disrupting the normal operations of an educational institution by either:
- b) Threatening to cause physical injury to any employee or student of an educational institution or any person or the property of an educational institution.

C. Abuse of teacher or school employee in school; classification A.R.S. 15-507

1. A person who knowingly abuses a teacher or other school employee on school grounds or while the teacher or employee is engaged in the performance of his duties is guilty of a class 3 misdemeanor.
