
Arts Signature Program

We were very careful when adopting a Signature Program for Sunset Hills. Surveys, focus groups, and strategic planning drove its development. The goal was never nor will ever be to turn all of our students into professional artists. It's about expanding the ways in which we teach and reach our students. We do not expect our core-area teachers to be Art or Music teachers; we love our talented Specialists and how they teach specific Arts-related skills! We do understand, however, that the Arts can be used to strengthen the core curriculum and provide for creativity in learning and assessment. To put it simply, the Arts help students make more sense of what they learn. Using a dramatic exercise in Science to demonstrate how an ear functions, with students each "becoming" a specific part can lead to a more meaningful and comprehensive understanding of its operation. Just last week, Ms. Owen's 4th graders used music in ELA to help them learn the three types of "point of view." By integrating a catchy tune with some light choreography, students not only have an easier time remembering them, but also have a more descriptive understanding of the indicators for each one. Sure, having thriving Arts programming is important to our Signature Program, but looking at learning core subjects through an artistic lens is empowering for students and teachers alike...and it's one of many characteristics that sets Sunset Hills apart.
