#### **PRINCIPAL'S LETTER**

Dear Sunset Hills Family,

The first quarter of the 2023-2024 school year has concluded and was a success! Our athletic seasons began with baseball, softball, and cross country. Additionally, our choirs represented Sunset Hills very well in the Dysart Festival of Choirs. Throughout the first quarter, academics have been the focus and we have seen great improvements in student growth this year as compared to last year already! Everyone continues to work collectively to ensure the success of our students!

Teachers have engaged in professional learning communities (PLCs) to use a backwards design model, which begins with taking the unit assessments that students will take, identify the skills needed to show mastery, and plan their instruction according to these skills, embedding effective instructional strategies in their planning. In addition, teachers come together in their PLCs to analyze data on common formative assessments within the units, and plan for whole group and small group instruction to reteach concepts that have not been mastered.

In order for our student to show mastery, they have to be present in school every day. We are closely tracking attendance each day, week, and month for each individual student. Grade levels with the highest attendance rate get a shout out on our social media each week, and there will be a reward for the class with the highest attendance rate across the school, each week. Thank you for your support in ensuring your student(s) are here each day, ready to learn!

Students in grades 3-8 will be taking benchmark tests in ELA and Math will be October 24 and 25. It is important that your child is at school on these days of testing and ready to do their best. Their teacher will take the data from these assessments and use them to set individual goals with your child and to plan instruction specific to the needs of their students.

As a reminder, conferences are the week of October 2-6. Our goal is 100% attendance at conferences. Teachers will be sharing 1st quarter grades and goals for your child to achieve in the 2nd quarter. Our teachers look forward to sharing your child's progress with you!

Fall break is the week of October 9-13. We look forward to seeing everyone back on October 16. The partnership with our families is essential for our student success! Thank you for your ongoing support and partnership! Have a wonderful and safe fall break!
