IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER WHEN CHOOSING ELECTIVES:

1. You must choose at least ONE PE, ONE Art/Music, and ONE iExplore course as your FIRST CHOICE at some point in the school year. *If you do not follow this instruction, one will be selected for you based on space.*
2. After you have chosen your three required courses, you may fill the rest of your schedule with courses of your choosing. *Please note, you will not be given PE for both A Day and B Day in a single quarter.*
3. Band or Choir can satisfy your one Art/Music course requirement (but you may choose additional Music courses if they will fit in your schedule).
4. While we do our best to schedule your preferred courses, please note that due to class dynamics and capacity we can not guarantee placement in any course.
5. Once Electives are selected and registered, the school will be unable to honor student/parent requests for schedule changes.
6. If your registration form is submitted after the deadline, your preferences will be considered, but your placement in classes of your choice may not be possible due to space or equipment limitations.

<p>Band</p>		<p><u>Band</u> Students will learn to play a band instrument, read music, play songs, and perform together for a Winter and Spring Concert at Shadow Ridge High School and the spring Festival of Arts. Most families choose to rent an instrument from Music&Arts for about \$23/month. The rental includes the instrument, repair, theft protection, and credit toward future purchase. There will be an instrument rental night at school in August. In addition, students are responsible for their instrument supplies (reeds, valve oil, etc.). There are also a small number of instruments available to rent through the school. These instruments are rented on a first come, first served basis each fall. Be aware that students with district instruments who are not active in rehearsal and home practice can have their instrument assigned to another student. Students will meet for band on Day A at a predetermined time during the school day once per week as long as they are not currently receiving a grade of D or F in core classes, and on Day B as a class during Electives. <i>This means students will have the opportunity to be in band up to 3 days per week while still participating in another Elective</i></p>

		<p>class (e.g. PE, Art, etc.) every quarter. All students enrolled in Band will be registered in the Elective for the full school year.</p>
<p>iExplore</p>	<p>Coding and Robotics Coding students will learn foundational skills in computational thinking, computing practice, and programming. They will decompose problems into smaller more manageable parts, and create algorithms to solve them. Students will use hands-on learning and robotics to explore computing concepts. To write programs, they will use visual (block-based) or text-based programming languages. By the end of the course students will be able to communicate what they have learned about sequence, loops, functions, and conditional statements. Students who work responsibly throughout the course will be applying their coding concepts and skills to hands-on robotics projects!</p>	<p>Creative Technology: Yearbook 1 (Photography) Our school's yearbook will be a student-created product, designed by 5th- 8th grade students who are interested in photography, journalism, and graphic design. Any students who want to take Yearbook 3 (Graphic Design) *must* take Yearbook 1 or 2 as the prerequisite course. During this quarter, students will learn and apply photography skills while focusing on various aspects of composition, identifying the features of the different manual modes of a DSLR camera, and applying editing skills to their photographs. The students will also create a mock yearbook page, using Canva, applying journalistic and graphic design skills. Any students are welcome to take Yearbook 1, even if they don't move onto Yearbook 2 or 3!! There will also be an optional afterschool Yearbook Club to attend as well.</p>
<p>Music</p>	<p>Moonrise Choir This performance-based course is designed to focus on singing as a group. Students will focus on learning different types of choral music, sight-reading, correct singing techniques, and performance etiquette. There will be required performances outside of the school day as part of the grade for this course (quarterly concerts, and performances at large events like AZ Diamondbacks and Phoenix Suns games). Additional information will go home on the first day of class in the syllabus. <i>Due to its nature, Choir is a semester long course.</i> To participate, students <i>must</i> join for quarters 1 AND 2 <i>or</i> quarters 3 AND 4. Students <i>are strongly encouraged</i> register for Choir for the whole year, though. A one-time course fee of \$20 is required for all performing members, which includes the official performance shirt. <i>Students who register for the whole year will still be able to participate in a second Elective course each quarter.</i></p>	<p>Jazz & Improvisation Learn about the history of jazz music while focusing on learning the basics of improvisation in music and other forms. By the end of the course students will be able to communicate what they have learned about sequence, loops, functions, and conditional statements. Students will also design, build, and program robots to investigate solutions and solve problems.</p>	<p><u>Creative Technology: Yearbook 3 (Graphic Design)</u> Our school's yearbook will be a student-created product, designed by 5th- 8th grade students who are interested in photography, journalism, and graphic design. Any students who want to take Yearbook 3 (Graphic Design) *must* take Yearbook 1 and/or 2 as the prerequisite course. During this quarter, students will learn and apply graphic design concepts as they synthesize the photos and journalism articles (from Yearbook 1/ Yearbook 2) into the final yearbook design. Students will be organized into editing teams who collaborate across the middle school grades and communicate effectively as a team in an afterschool Yearbook Club.</p>

Elective FAQ's

What grade levels get to participate?

Grades 5-8 will have Electives for the entire school year.

Does this replace my Specials time?

Yes. Instead of having to participate in all Specials classes, the Specials teachers are offering more personalized classes and students will get to choose which courses they attend.

Who is teaching the classes?

Special Area Teachers - PE, Music, Art, Band, iExplore

What if I still want to go to every Specials class?

Students get to choose 8 Electives for the year. When signing up for classes students can select one from every subject area if they choose.

What does it mean by Day A and Day B?

Each quarter students will get to attend two different Electives. One Elective will be held on Tuesday and Thursdays (Day A), the other Elective will be held on Wednesdays and Fridays (Day B). Mondays will alternate between A and B days each week.

What courses am I required to take?

During the course of the school year, each student must take at least one PE, one MUSIC/ART and one iEXPLORE Elective. The only exception to this rule: Students who enroll in Choir AND Band *for the full year* are excused from taking other classes (this requires both parent and principal approval).

What if I want to take a class more than once?

Students cannot be enrolled in the same Elective class on both Day A and Day B (e.g. Team Sports A on both Day A and Day B). Electives are offered by quarter so that there is no opportunity to “repeat” a class in a different quarter. There are a few exceptions: Band, Choir, Musical Theatre, and Creative Technology. Band is a year-long commitment for all members. Choir requires a year-long commitment for those students participating in off-campus/travel opportunities, but those students who register for one semester can still participate during the day and at school concerts. Students interested in participating in this year’s school musical, which also requires an after-school commitment, are *highly* encouraged to register for *both* Musical Theatre courses. Creative Technology includes support and participation in our daily Morning Announcements on video, which benefits from consistency in participation. These are the only Electives that may be taken more than once, as their content is continuous. **Students who select the same Elective on Day A and B will lose their selection entirely and be placed in another Elective class of the school’s choosing based on class size.**

Can I take Band, Choir or Creative Technology all year?

Yes. These are performance-based classes. Due to its nature, Band is a required year-long commitment. If a student chooses Choir, it is recommended that they sign up for the whole year (it is required for a full year if planning to participate in off campus/travel opportunities). Creative Technology will have ongoing projects and applications that vary as the year progresses. Students in these courses will still have another Elective class that will change each quarter if they choose to participate in Band, Choir, or Creative Technology for the full year.

Can I take Band AND Choir?

Yes. If you choose both classes for the full year, you must have parent and principal approval. If you prefer to take Band all year and Choir for just one semester, you must select a PE and iExplore course in the two quarters that you are not enrolled in Choir (either Q1 & Q2 OR Q3 & Q4). *Choir students who intend on traveling to Disneyland to perform (who are also in Band) must be in Choir for quarters 3 and 4.*

Why didn’t I get all of my top choices?

6th Grade

We do our best to schedule you into all your top choices. Reasons for not getting your selections will more than likely be due to scheduling conflicts and when courses are offered or class caps, but may also result from not following the registration instructions.

When will I know what my classes are?

Students will know their courses when they get your class schedule at the beginning of the school year.

Will I be able to change my schedule later?

No. Once the sign-up process is completed, we cannot offer a schedule change. Please take time to make your decisions carefully and discuss it as a family, as *only school administrators are able to request changes*.

Can I take all courses in the same discipline (e.g. PE for every class, all year long)?

No, but you can select them for *most* of your choices. For instance, all students are required to participate in one section of iExplore, Art/Music, and one PE section during the course of the year (and students have a choice as to which they will take). The remaining four sections are completely of the student's preference.

Is there a cost?

Specials courses do not have a cost with the exception of Band and Choir. Band students generally will need to provide their own instruments, either through ownership or rental, however the school does have a small selection of instruments that can be rented from the district for a relatively small fee. This will be discussed in the first week of school. Choir requires the purchase of a uniform shirt. While there is no cost for the Musical Theatre Elective, there are fees associated with participating in the school musical.
