Handbook Focus of the Week

Student Conduct at Athletic Events – WIN with Noble Character

Attendance at school-sponsored events is a privilege, not a right. All students are expected to follow the Student Conduct and Discipline guidelines at all times, including before, during, and after events. These expectations apply at school, while traveling to and from events, and at games and competitions.

Athletic and performance events should be fun, energetic, and positive. Students are encouraged to cheer, support their teams, and enjoy the experience—while remaining respectful. Disrespectful behavior, inappropriate language, refusal to follow directions from staff or event supervisors, or actions that disrupt an event will not be tolerated. Students who fail to meet expectations may be removed from the event and face additional school consequences, including loss of future event privileges.

How we conduct ourselves matters. Our behavior reflects our character and represents our school, our winning culture, and our WIN values. Noble Character—respect, self-control, integrity, and sportsmanship—defines how we WIN, on and off the field.



School Parking

School parking lots are part of campus and subject to school rules and state law. Students must park only in designated areas and obey posted signs and speed limits. Handicap spaces, fire lanes, and staff parking must remain clear at all times. Unsafe driving or improper parking may result in school discipline or enforcement action.
