Homecoming Dress Code

Dual Enrollment vs. IB Testing Fees

We know the different fees can get confusing, so here's the quick breakdown:

Dual Enrollment Fees → Paid to the partner college (like Rio Salado). These are tuition costs per semester course and allow students to earn both high school + college credit at the same time.

IB Testing Fees → Paid to the school/IB Organization. Students pay a flat \$100 fee per year for IB exams, and the district covers the rest. These fees are tied to the end-of-course IB exams that can also lead to college credit.

Think of it this way:

Dual Enrollment = college tuition per course
IB = flat annual testing fee for IB exams
IB testing fees are being added to student accounts this week
and can be paid through the Bookstore.

Both give students a chance to earn college credit while still in high school!
