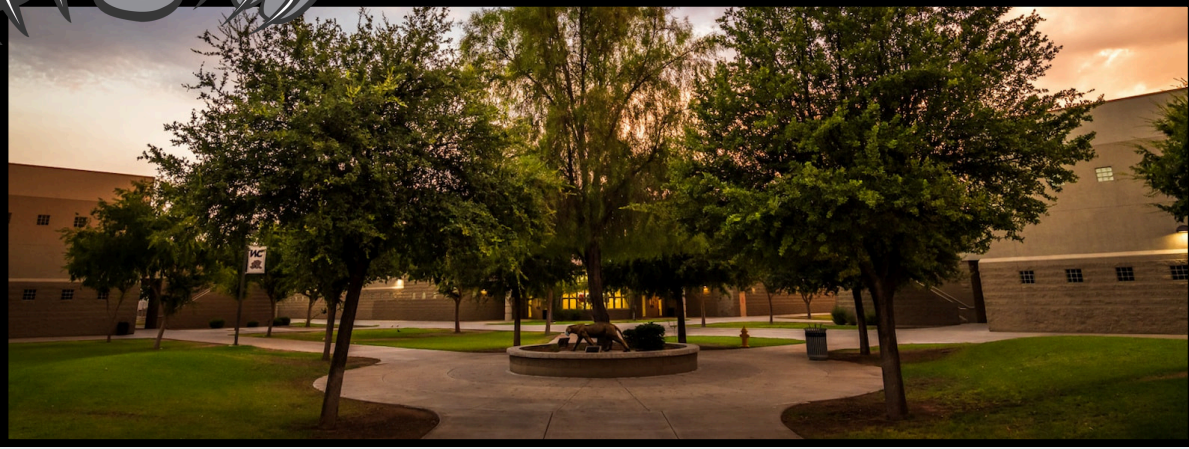




What's Up, Wildcats?

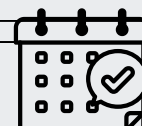

Handbook Focus of the Week

DRESS CODE

Dysart Unified School District believes that there is a connection between Student Dress and Academic Success. As such, any attire that detracts from the learning environment is not acceptable. Students should dress in a manner that takes into consideration the educational environment, safety, health and welfare of oneself and others. The following guidelines are not intended to be entirely inclusive of all dress code situations. The school administration retains the final discretion to determine that the clothing or accessory meets the dress code. Some exceptions may be made for special events, formal attire (dances), spirit week, or costumes. It is the students and their parent/guardian's responsibility to be aware of the dress code policy and conform to these requirements. Each school will meet the minimum guidelines of the district dress code but may add other restrictions if the school administration deems it necessary. If a student or parent has any questions about whether specific attire or accessories are in compliance with the dress code, they should contact the Assistant Principal prior to wearing such attire.

Non compliance with the established student dress code guidelines can result in change of clothes to short term suspension.



STUDENT PARKING LOT

If a student or faculty employee find someone parked in their assigned parking space, please do the following IF the vehicle is empty:

1.) Take a picture of the license plate, space number and the parking permit which should be attached to the rear view mirror.
